Ann Levin Meyer, age 95, of Mequon, passed away peacefully on June 4, 2026.

Born on February 16, 1931, Ann was the only child of Frank and Isabel (Belond) Levin. Ann grew up in Whitefish Bay and graduated from Whitefish Bay High School. She attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where she met her future husband Alvin, before finishing her degree at the National College of Education in Evanston, IL. Ann enjoyed being with small children and worked as a substitute kindergarten teacher for over 50 years. Perhaps in part because of her profession, she was known for handwriting so neat it could be considered its own font.

After marrying in 1952, Ann and Alvin settled in Shorewood. There Ann raised their three children and supported Alvin as he served the community as Village Attorney. Later, "Gran Ann" helped to care for her granddaughters when they were young and remained close with them throughout their lives.

Ann will be remembered for being a terrific friend, in ways both big and small. She supported several dear friends through serious health crises and stayed in close contact with her friends' children over the years. Her phone rang off the hook, and once call-waiting was invented, it wasn't unusual for her to switch back and forth between her many callers. Her address book was

meticulously organized, and she sent out birthday and holiday cards like clockwork.

Ann was a competitive player of board and card games, never giving an easy win to her opponent (even her own granddaughters). She played Triominos up until her last week of life. She was also an avid reader who kept a careful record of every book she read in order to ensure she never checked the same one out from the library twice.

Ann adored photos, unfazed by the eyerolls she received at every family gathering when she insisted on taking group pictures. Ann's passion for capturing moments with loved ones led her to compile over a dozen albums of her family and friends, each photo neatly arranged in chronological order with handwritten labels identifying the people and location. The albums Ann created will be treasured family keepsakes for many years to come.

Ann is survived by her children, Lynn (Rick) Conn, Ellen (Bill) Wruck, and David (Kristi) Meyer, as well as three granddaughters: Katie Conn, Liz Conn, and Amanda Meyer. She was preceded in death by her husband of 54 years, Alvin Meyer, her brother-in-law Bert, and her sister-in-law Penny, with whom she shared a sisterly bond and many adventures.

The family would like to thank the staff of Hearts to Home, Badger Hospice, and Elizabeth Residence for the compassionate care they have provided over the last years of Ann's life. Ann delighted in her friendships with her fellow residents and her caregivers.

A graveside service will be held at 10 AM Wednesday, June 10, 2026 at Spring Hill Cemetery, 166 South Hawley Court, Milwaukee.

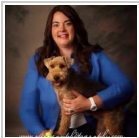
