“David and I were friends and colleagues. We met about 2.5 years ago and very quickly felt like family. I am admittedly heartbroken. The last time I spoke to him, the Tuesday before he was moved to the ICU, he had told me not to worry. His Covid-19 numbers were going down and his oxygen concentration was getting better. I was fixing molding on my windows which was rotting. I was outside shivering and we were discussing the lack of possible return for replacing the windows in my home, which is falling apart. He walked me through the math and said the money for new windows could never be recovered, to forget it. I asked him if he was scared and he told me that he had been, the night before, but wasn't any longer. He was surely going to get better. We mocked the current administration and talked January. Prior to getting sick, David called nearly every day about a project we were working on and would start the call with "Can you talk?" I rarely said, "No," though David could hear it in my voice if I was stressing about something else. He would tell me not to worry, I'd figure it all out and should call him back. He'd remind me to send out the billing to my clients, something that has always eluded me. He always asked about my family and when I was feeling down, he'd send me Jewish jokes from a Facebook site he found, the raunchier the better. He was always joking about something. He frequently told me about something or another that one of his kids had done that had made him proud. He had lovely stories of his grandchildren. He laughed, a lot, often as some stupid piece of news or something he'd overheard someone say that struck him as utterly absurd. I am at work now and it feels a bit different, cloudier, darker. My days will not be the same. David was a beautiful and welcoming person, a hard-ass in his own right. He introduced me to a constant voice in my head reminding me to make sure I get paid for the work I do. He liked to tell me about new shows or movies he'd found and introduced me to the "Beauty and the Baker," the "Queen's Gambit," "Fauda" and a number of books to read. Happy Birthday, David. I hope you are celebrating it well wherever you may be now. To his family - he was endlessly proud. He was deeply in love with Pam and I am grateful to have known him and to have through his stories

gotten to know his family.
