He served in the Air Force for two-years, with a stint in Greenland and then at Vandenburg Airforce Base in Monterey, California. His love for fishing began as a child on the boundary waters of Camp Manito-wish in Boulder Junction and later included fishing with his boys in Canada and Florida. As he aged, he took up golf, joining Brynwood Country Club and Arrowhead Country Club in Phoenix, where he wintered. He started skiing as a child and first skied at Aspen in 1949 and during his medical residency, served on the ski patrol at Winter Park. He skied the world with family and friends in tow. He was a wonderful father, always putting the needs of his family ahead of his own. We will all
