“ Scott was part of the independence first family for 32 years, over 14 years as an employee of Independence First and 18 years on our Board of Directors in various rolls including two separate occasions fulfilling the roll of Board Chair.

Scott was a tireless advocate for disability rights, earning him the award from the Wisconsin Coalition of Independent Living “The Relentless Badger” in the State of Wisconsin. His unwavering commitment to inclusion and justice was recognized by BizTimes Milwaukee, which named him a Notable Board Member.

Scott was part of a recent effort resulting in a historic court case clarifying Wisconsin’s voting laws. He was part of a federal lawsuit challenging barriers that made it unclear whether people with disabilities could receive assistance submitting their ballots during elections. Scott’s story, and the arguments of the other plaintiffs, were compelling enough to win the case. As a result, people with disabilities in Wisconsin now have the right to receive voting assistance, ensuring equal access to the ballot box.

Scott’s impact will continue to be felt by the many lives he touched through his leadership, compassion, and fierce advocacy. He was a dear friend to all at Independence First and will be profoundly missed. Our prayers go out to the family during this difficult time.-
