And years later I remember meeting you in San Francisco where you took me out to lunch and bought me the gift of “The Beatles Illustrated Lyrics.” I remember you bringing your future husband Ron to see me perform at the Kenwood Inn at UWM. I remember helping you create a “board game” about the Nixon administration for a class you were taking — and you got an A. I remember you. I will always ALWAYS remember you.
